Away Rotation- Well Child Development in Guatemala

Thanks to the Warren and Rosalee Heffron Scholarship, I had the opportunity to go to Guatemala and start a seed project for well child development. I was in contact with the Institute of Inclusive Health that has been working in the most remote rural areas of the Verapaces in Guatemala. This institution has been a pioneer to create a new model of cultural inclusive primary care, which was made possible due to the opening of the Ministry of Health. This model approaches health care at the individual, family and community level. There is a clear involvement in the community from the health workers to provide the attention the people need; however, there is a lot to improve when it comes to well child checks. Historically, the focus of the Ministry of Health has been on nutrition and growth, leaving behind the rest of the child's cognitive and social development. My project started as a research proposal to screen child development. I traveled to communities that showed a global improvement in family health to present a proposal to incorporate screenings for child development. It was a great experience to work with the local health authorities and with the Institute of Inclusive Health. This is the first step in the work that I hope to continue; improving children's health care in my home, Guatemala. - Magda

Recruitment Season Update

The HMS FMRP 2016-2017 resident recruitment season is under way! The Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS), opened mid-September and applicants from all over the world were able to apply for residency positions. So far, HMS FMRP has received 997 applications. The program began interviews in October and will continue on through January with the hopes of interviewing 35-40 applicants for the two PGY1 positions. All applicants selected to interview, will interview both in Silver City and in Las Cruces as Memorial Medical Center is our first year training site. Let the interviewing begin!
