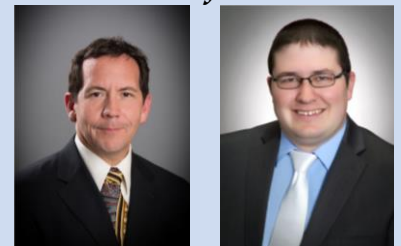

## **First Year Residents Spend Time Visiting Home Residency in Silver City**

*The HMS FMRP is a 1+2 residency program, meaning that 1st year residents complete their first year in a larger academic medical center and then complete their 2nd and 3rd years on-site at HMS. Both Dr. Aguero and Dr. Keys will complete their first year of residency at Memorial Medical Center in Las Cruces, and will complete their final two years of residency training at the HMS Community Health Center in Silver City.*

*Over the course of their first year at MMC, the residents have a total of two, two-week long rotations to spend at HMS in Silver City. This is a time for them to get acquainted with the flow of clinics at HMS and to become more familiar with their colleagues and the Silver City Community. This is also a unique learning opportunity to spend one on one time shadowing FMRP faculty and senior residents during clinics and didactics. This past month, it was Dr. Roberto Aguero's turn to spend some time with us here in Silver City. Dr. Aguero will return for another rotation later in the year. Look out for Dr. Rory Keys when he comes for his HMS visits later this academic year in winter and spring.*
