### 2015 AAFP National Conference- Kansas City, MO

Program Director Dr. Nelson, Resident Physicians Drs. Schumacher and Seltzer and Program Coordinator Jade Zamora recently attended the 2015 American Academy of Family Physicians National Conference in Kansas City, MO. More than 300 residency programs and 50 physician employers, plus medical missions, government agencies, had the opportunity to meet with Medical Students on the verge of residency from all over the world. Through the New Mexico Primary Care Training Consortium, Silver City, Albuquerque, Santa Fe and Las Cruces represented their individual Family Medicine Residency Programs.

Also while at the National Conference, Drs. Schumacher and Seltzer presented the HMS FMRP Idalia Rodriguez Immunization Grant Poster. The grant was awarded to Hidalgo Medical Services Family Medicine Residency Program in June of 2014 with the purpose of increasing vaccination rates in the 65+ population specifically with influenza and pneumococcal vaccinations. HMS FMRP was one of 16 residency programs throughout the country awarded the grant. HMS FMRP's efforts included implementing quality improvement measures to increase awareness amongst providers as well as the community. The information collected can be shared with city and county government officials, community health councils and non-profit organizations that serve seniors in the region as well as used to inform future vaccination outreach efforts.
